

### Birth Characteristics

are the features of a newborn baby, which can include birth weight and height, length of birth term, and type of delivery.

This graph represents the number of preterm live births by race for a span of 3 years. From 2019 to 2021, **the average** number of live births that are preterm are:

- **86.1** for babies that are white.
- **150.2** for babies that are black.
- **74.1** for babies that are asian/pacific islander.
- 116.5 for babies that are hispanic



#### Measurement of Weight at Birth

> 3 lb, 4 oz and below is very low birthweight.

> > 5 lb, 8 oz and below is low birthweight.

< 8 lb, 13 oz and above is high birthweight.

This graph represents the number of live births compared by birthweight and level of prenatal care. The following rates represent the approximate percentages of those **who received intermediate or inadequate levels of prenatal care** compared to birthweight.

- **51%** of very low birthweight
- 48% of low birthweight
- 25% of high birthweight
